## Community: Welcome to Englishtown!

Spring is in the air in beautiful Englishtown! Tulips, Daffodils and Butterflies are in bloom! The Borough has a lot planned, and Summer is right around the corner! As the Spring weather brings great opportunities for spending time outdoors you may notice some improvements going on around the Borough!

The borough is implementing a sidewalk cleanup, and has invited the Community Development Committee to assist. This includes the flowering beds located at various points on the sidewalks by Borough Hall.

If you have not heard, the Park has already began improvements and cleanup efforts that are in full swing! The Mayor and Council hope to bring plenty of afternoon sports to the park for the local teams! Stay tuned for more information and announcements on the Park, including: open and closing hours,

along with parking times.

At the Council meeting that took place on September 22, 2021, the Mayor and Council announced that the Borough will be looking into adding additional lighting and other improvements that will enhance the down town area. The Council also anticipates the addition of a parking lot for our store fronts to be completed sometime this season. The new parking lot is located on the side of the Town Hall Building, and will help with additional parking.

Topics like this are all discussed during the monthly council meetings that are announced and held every 4th Wednesday of the month at the Borough Hall located on Main Street. Meetings begin at 6:30pm and open to the general public.

The Mayor and Council have

also introduced the Community Development Committee that meets on the 2nd Thursday of every month at 6:30pm. If you are interested in volunteering and becoming a member of the committee, or have any suggestions please feel free to join a meeting!

## Englishtown Public Utility: GARBAGE UTILITY

Garbage pickup in the borough—twice a week, every Tuesday and Friday, along with (1)one bulk item on Fridays remains in effect. Recycling—twice a month on every 2nd and 4th weds of the month will remain in effect.

Garbage cans are to be left out in the evenings and returned from the street in the mornings.

New News: The Garbage pickup will remain the same, uninterrupted!

As of April 1, 2022 the garbage will now be considered a "Utility", and the residents will be responsible for remitting payment to the Borough.
